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The emphasis which has been placed in recent days on the desirability or necessity for control and surveillance of communist or subversive activities in Mexico has broken out publicly in two spectacular cases during the past week.

The first involved the arrest of Enrique RICART Cortes, a Spanish Republican resident of Chihuahua City, together with the seizure of his radio transmitter and receiver on charges of unauthorized operation of this radio equipment; the further inference in connection with the arrest, and it of course became much more than an inference in the newspaper headlines, was that Ricart had been active in transmitting and receiving espionage information in code. The newspapers even reported, on the basis of an interview with the Communications Inspector responsible for the raid, that certain code books had been found in Ricart's possession but no information was furnished as to the kind of messages Ricart was supposed to have been handling. The second case, which has undoubtedly received considerable attention in American newspapers, was the arrest by the Mexican police (and delivery to American authorities in Laredo) of Morton SOBELL, an American fugitive suspected of complicity in the delivery of atomic research material to Russia.

In the first instance, from what the Embassy has thus far been able to ascertain, the basis of the action appears to have been more a desire on the part of certain Mexican officials to gain notoriety than any serious evidence of espionage. As a matter of fact, after two or three days of excited treatment of the subject, the newspapers seem to have lost all interest and for the past three days there has not even been a mention of the matter in the pages of local papers. It is suspected that Ricart was simply a radio "ham" who had been operating without a license and the Communications Department inspector who handled the case, Jesus GALINDO VASQUEZ, saw in it an opportunity to make a name for himself by suggesting that Ricart was considerably

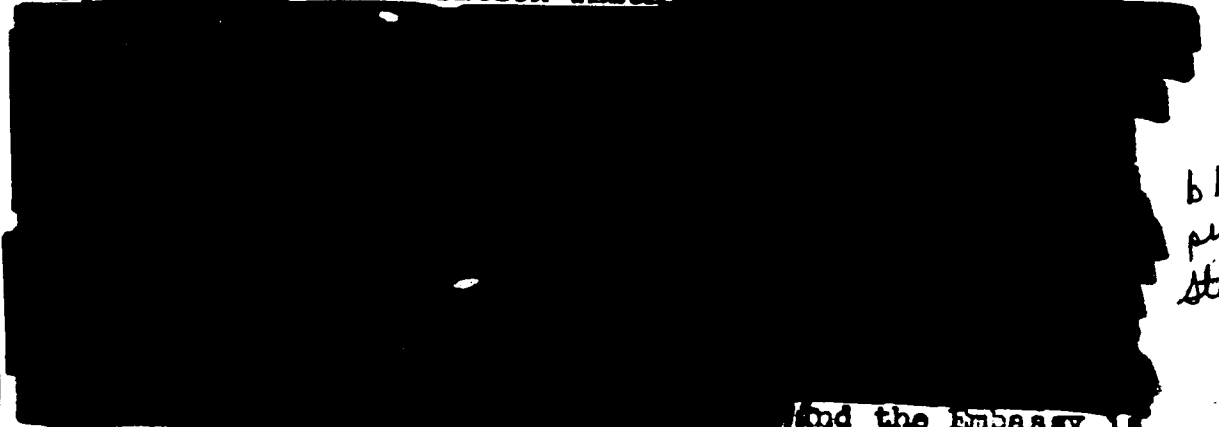

more important than he actually is. This suspicion is supported by a conversation which



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95 and the Embassy is not even positive that Ricart has been brought to the Capital. Every effort is being made, however, to keep in close touch with developments and if it should become apparent that Ricart's activities were such as to merit further investigation the Embassy will of course undertake to obtain information available and forward it to the Department. Incidentally, a report received from the Consulate in Chihuahua on August 23 bears out the Embassy's supposition as outlined above; the Consulate describes Ricart as innocent of any subversive activities and local feeling in Chihuahua as considering that the incident is without political significance.

The second case, that of Sobell, is of considerably more significance and importance. Sobell, who arrived in Mexico with his wife and two children on June 22, actually was, as the Department is aware, a fugitive from American Justice and the Legal Attaché of the Embassy received instructions toward the end of July to endeavor to locate Sobell and to have him returned to the United States. The Legal Attaché, with the complete cooperation of the Federal Security Police, was successful in this after more than two weeks of intensive investigation. On the evening of August 15 Sobell was arrested by the police. He and his family were immediately conducted to the border by automobile and early in the morning of August 17 he was delivered to the American authorities in Laredo.

The Legal Attaché reports that Sobell apparently had no contact of any importance with other persons in Mexico and the Legal Attaché is satisfied that he probably was acting entirely on his own. There is some slight evidence that Sobell may have been in touch with the Polish Legation in an effort to obtain a visa for Poland but there is no evidence that he was given a welcome reception in either that Legation or any of the other communist or iron curtain missions. The Legal Attaché is inclined to believe that

these missions had no interest in Sobell following his failure in maintaining the secrecy of his activities in the United States but, to the contrary, were anxious to avoid any contact with him here which might later prove embarrassing to them. There was even evidence that Sobell had visited Veracruz and perhaps Mérida with the intention of stowing away on board some outgoing ship, without benefit of passport or visa.

PURPOSE

To advise results of a telephone call received from ASAC Whalen, New York Office, at 5:30 P.M., March 22, 1951.

DETAILS

On March 22, 1951, pursuant to your instructions, I took a call from ASAC Whalen, New York Office, at 5:30 P.M., at which time he related the following information concerning individuals working at the Reeves Instrument Company requested by the Bureau on March 21, 1951.

At the outset Mr. Whalen pointed out that any civilian contractor can hire whatever personnel he desires even though he is working on classified contracts for the armed forces and must get clearance before such individuals may work on such contracts. The procurement section of the Army, Navy, or Air Force, whichever has a contract with the facility involved, is responsible to see that security checks are made on employees who will be employed in or will have access to restricted areas.

Harry D. Belock

Belock was employed by the Reeves Company in 1944 and left in October, 1950. The records of G-2 reflect that Belock was originally cleared in 1942 as the result of an agency check. He was again cleared in 1946 based on the consent of the Secretary of War.

When the Bureau directed a letter to the New York Office in 1948 with regard to the Procli Program on this particular concern, the New York Office contacted the president and the general manager at which time the jurisdiction of the FBI was explained to them. Mr. Whalen pointed out that the company was eligible for contracts and whether they had them or not did not concern the office at that time as we did nothing more than explain the FBI's jurisdiction to them.

SAC Letter No. 62 dated August 31, 1950, regarding plant informants advised that all of our contacts in the Procli Program should be made plant informants.

No indices check was necessary at that time and even though a check had been made there was no derogatory information concerning Belock himself.

New York submitted a report on July 3, 1943, concerning this subject. A request was received for information from the Navy in 1947 and also from G-2 in the same year. Available information at that time was furnished to the Navy and G-2. It was pointed out by Mr. Whalen that information was made available to the interested agencies during the time Meyler was employed at the Reeves Company. In addition, Mr. Whalen pointed out that an investigative report had been received from the Navy in 1948 from the Third Naval District. He also stated that an LGE investigation was instituted on April 4, 1949, but was discontinued on April 21, 1949.

Lewis Reese

Reese was sales representative for the Reeves Company and the subject of a security investigation. Reports of our investigation were disseminated locally to ONI, OSI, and G-2.

Reese was employed by the Reeves Company in April of 1948 and resigned February 23, 1951. The Army, Navy, and Air Force were aware of the fact that the FBI had a pending case on Reese and were alerted to the derogatory information available in the DIO files which had been previously disseminated by the Bureau. Reese was never given clearance. Reese was never authorized to have access to classified contracts because the Navy had not cleared him.

Morton Sobell

MRS. MORTON SOBELL

Clearance was issued for Sobell in 1949. However, a certificate of denial was later issued. Sobell appealed the issuance of this certificate and his case was brought before a three-man board in Washington, D. C. He subsequently received clearance.

The records of G-2 reflect that Sobell was investigated in 1947 at which time G-2 performed a local agency check. No derogatory information was indicated at that time. On February 16, 1948, the G-2 file reflected derogatory information concerning Helen Gurewitz, Sobell's wife's name by a previous marriage.

HELEN

The Navy actually wrote a letter to the admiral in charge of ONI making a particular protest of Sobell's case. Commander Lenhardt was particularly interested in Sobell's case. Mr. Whalen pointed out that the Bureau is in good shape with regard to Sobell inasmuch as the other intelligence agencies were furnished with pertinent information in this regard. The Navy is also "in the clear" inasmuch as they had made several protests regarding Sobell.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS: Records Signal Corps Procurement Agency indicate Amendment No. 1, SCL 2116 may have been returned from Reeves Instrument Corp. but cannot be located in files. Records Mail and Records Section, Evans Signal Lab. reflect Specification No. SCL-1137 and Block Diagram ES-E-72784-A forwarded by Signal Corps to Reeves 8/29/47 and have not been returned. No record in M and R Section reflecting return of Spec. SCL-2112 or Spec. SCL-2116. Records Radar Branch ESL failed to disclose any of above four documents. Records Fort Monmouth indicate a number of visits by Russian Nationals to Fort Monmouth during World War II with access to information classified to "secret". No indication subject officially connected with visits. Associates of BELOCK during employment CESL advise he was "dynamic personality", well liked, and highly regarded as an engineer, taking a number of CESL employees to Reeves with him when he left. All believe him to be trustworthy and loyal. No indication of contact with Russian visitors or in influencing contracts. Records SCPA reflect letting of contracts to McGlynn-Hays Co. during BELOCK'S Army employment but none for plotting board equipment.

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With regard to ANDREW SOORIN, Newark T-1 advised that his records reflect only that ANDREW J. SOORIN, associate engineer, (radio P-3) was employed at Fort Monmouth, being transferred to the Air Force Laboratories, Eatontown, N.J. 2/1/45. The exact date of employment at Fort Monmouth was not indicated but clearance was requested on 10/9/42 indicating that he had been employed shortly prior to that time. His residence was shown as Box 20, RFD, Long Branch, N.J. and his birthplace as Kazan, Russia. The records indicate that both of his parents had also been born in Russia. His father was listed as deceased.

HANS FELIX INSLEMAN in a Personal History Statement submitted in connection with his employment at Fort Monmouth, N.J., indicated he is a brother of FELIX INSLEMAN.

WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, a self-admitted former Soviet espionage agent, has identified FELIX INSLEMAN as the individual known to him as "FELIX," who was a photographer for a Communist Party underground apparatus in 1937 and 1938.

The files of Newark T-3, mentioned above, reflect that during May 1941 it was determined that CHARLOTTE KAPLAN, wife of JACOB KAPLAN was a Communist.

SAS LOUIS G. TURNER and REGINALD C. VINCENT that he and MORTON SOBELL, who is mentioned previously, were childhood friends and that he had continuous contacts with SOBELL while employed at Ft. Monmouth, N.J. BOOKENDER further advised that he had no knowledge of SOBELL's espionage activities. In a Personnel History Statement, submitted by BOOKENDER, in connection with his employment at Ft. Monmouth, BOOKENDER listed BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN, 1302 Turner Ave., Wanamassa, N.J. as a reference.

The records of Newark Confidential Informant T-1, mentioned above, reflect that BENJAMIN ZUCKERMAN advised a representative of that agency on 1/3/51, that he was a former classmate of MORTON SOBELL at CCNY, that he had been friendly with SOBELL until the latter's arrest on espionage charges, and that SOBELL had stayed at his home at Wanamassa, N.J. during SOBELL's visits to the Watson Laboratories, Red Bank, N.J. The Watson Laboratories have been mentioned previously as a facility of the Department of the Air Force, formerly located at Red Bank, N.J.

HORACE C. WILSON, JR.

Subject's personnel file maintained at Ft. Monmouth, N.J. reflects that captioned individual was one of GREENBLUM's co-workers prior to subject's employment at that installation. It is set forth subsequently in this report that WILSON was a member of a 1940 Signal Corps Training class at Ft. Monmouth, N.J. which was also attended by JULIUS ROSENBERG and JOSEPH LEVITSKY and CARL GREENBLUM.

MORTON SOBELL

SOBELL is mentioned previously in this report as having been convicted in federal court on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage.

On 11/4/50, SAS THOMAS KELLY and CARLTON C. LENZ interviewed [REDACTED] in reference to other matters. [REDACTED] advised that he graduated from CCNY a half year after SOBELL and knew SOBELL only casually. [REDACTED] stated that as far as his association with SOBELL was concerned during his school years, there was none and that the extent of his acquaintance with SOBELL on a social basis since that time has been having lunch with him on two or three occasions. [REDACTED] declared that his luncheon engagements with SOBELL occurred during the time SOBELL was employed by the Reeves Instrument Company in New York, while [REDACTED]

An appeal of the case of five attorneys convicted of Contempt of Court following their defense of the 11 convicted Communist leaders is now before the United States Supreme Court. All received jail sentences from Federal District Judge Harold R. Medina, who accused them of deliberately misbehaving in his New York Court in an attempt to disrupt the Government's case and cause a mistrial. The attorneys are:

- Richard ~~GLADSTEIN~~, San Francisco, 18 counts, sentenced to six months in jail
- George ~~CROCKETT~~, Detroit Negro, 9 counts, sentenced to four months in jail
- Abraham J. ~~ISSERMAN~~, Newark, N.J., 7 counts, sentenced to four months in jail
- Louis F. ~~McCABE~~, Philadelphia, 6 counts, sentenced to 30 days in jail

Eugene DENNIS of New York, one of the 11 Communists who acted as his own defense attorney, also drew a six-month sentence on five Contempt counts.

The appeal of Julius and Ethel ~~ROSENBERG~~, convicted atomic bomb spies under death sentence, is now before the United States Court of Appeals in New York City. The defense contention is that they are being given "cruel and unusual punishment" and that they have been convicted for political non-conformity. The appeal of another of the atom bomb spies, Morton ~~SOBELL~~, sentenced to 30 years, is also before the Court. Because of the importance of the case, it is expected that the Court will take at least 30 days for its consideration.

In the case of the ROSENBERGS, a ~~NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR THE ROSENBERGS~~ has been established with headquarters at 246 Fifth Avenue, New York City. Its purpose is to solicit funds and to prepare nationwide protests through the circulation of literature, a tour of speakers in their behalf, and the organization of public meetings. 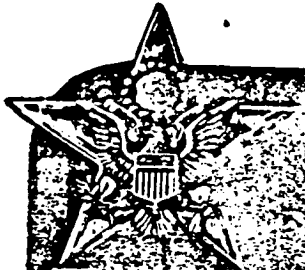

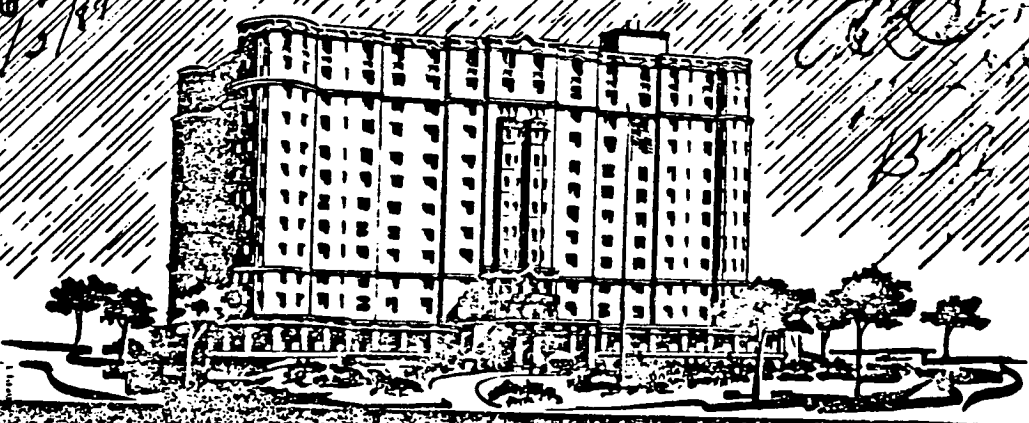

OK [Elmer BENSON, one of the national co-chairmen of the PROGRESSIVE PARTY (PP), a Communist and former governor of Minnesota, has been named by the PP of Pennsylvania as its choice for Presidential candidate.

A U.S. Court of Appeals has upheld the death penalty imposed on atom spies Julius and Ethel ROSENBERG and the 20-year prison term given to Morton SOBELL. (See WIS No. 6, '52, p. 13 & No. 5, '52 pp 10-11)

O/S [The LOS ANGELES COMMUNIST PARTY has reportedly prepared 500 copies of a statement for use by Party members saying that Anna Louise STRONG was expelled from the USSR as a spy and is currently "an enemy agent" who is guilty of "rotten liberalism." The statement also called her an "enemy of the peace policies of the Soviet Union and of the peace program of our party". (Source, HQ Sixth Army DI Summary No. 2, 31 January 1952)

COMMENT: The exact position of Anna Louise STRONG has been a moot question since her return (See WIS No. 11, '50 p. 5 & No. 49, '51, p. 9) to the United States after many years of residence in Russia where she was known as an outstanding protagonist of the Communist system. She has actually or ostensible broken with the COMMUNIST PARTY. The source says that she is rumored to have become a Trotskyite. (1)

The Chicago Tribune, 23 February, carried a picture of the North-lake (Illinois) Crime Commission. Shown in the picture was an Air Force sergeant who was identified as Ed HORAN.

COMMENT: Although not identified as the same individual, an Ed HORAN, aka Edward PALAGA, aka Edward LASKEY, has been reliably reported to be a Communist. He is a member of the ABRAHAM LINCOLN BRIGADE and was present at a birthday ball given by the organization in 1942. At that time he was employed as a machinist and chief inspector in a defense plant.

A pro-Communist Negro attorney, Earl B. DICKERSON, was recently named a member of a semi-permanent civic organization to combat crime in Chicago. (See WIS No. 8, '52, pp 4-5)

OKUN since February 1, 1945, had been an employee of the Air Force Watson Laboratory, Red Bank, New Jersey. It is noted that one of the classified documents found was a Watson Laboratory publication.

JACK OKUN, aka Jacob Okun, was the subject of an LGE investigation, the results of which were furnished in the report of SA JOHN M. MASTERSON, Newark, 12/14/48, entitled "JACK OKUN, aka Jacob Okun, Coordinator, Watson


o/s [A check of the records of the Signal Corps Procurement Agency, Fort Monmouth, reflects that the Reeves Company, then known as the Reeves Sound Laboratories, Inc., received their first contract on May 24, 1944, from the Signal Corps.

Mr. A. J. DALTON, Chief of the Agency, advised that there had been continuous contracts with Reeves since that time and a conservative estimate would be that their value exceeds \$1,000,000.

Captain WILLIAM PETERSON, Security Office, Signal Corps Engineering Laboratory, advised that his office is charged with obtaining clearances on representatives of civilian contracting companies so that they might have access to classified information when consulting with Signal Corps employees. He advised that numerous persons had been cleared by the Army for this purpose. With reference to the Reeves Instrument Company, he advised that MORTON SOBELL is not mentioned in his file at all. *Reeves per Army*

With regard to SOBELL'S visit, PETERSON further advised that notwithstanding the lack of clearance, SOBELL could have visited the Laboratory and obtained visitor's passes as a representative of Reeves or as a plain civilian visiting an associate.

A further review of visitors' records fails to reflect any additional visits by SOBELL, although from 1944 there have been numerous visits by representatives of the Reeves Company.

MORTON SOBELL, arrested for alleged espionage activity, in his employment record at Reeves Instrument Corporation, New York City, listed COLEMAN as a reference whom he had known for twelve years. Also, SOBELL, as a representative of the Reeves Instrument Corporation, which is engaged in Signal Corps contracts, visited COLEMAN at Evans Signal Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, NJ, on 6/26/47, although SOBELL was not cleared for access to classified matters there. COLEMAN alleged to have attended YCL meetings during student days at CCNY. He is reported to have made Communistic comments while a civilian employee at Fort Monmouth. COLEMAN charged with violation of Fort Monmouth security regulations and given ten days suspension for same after search of his home by another Government agency disclosed 48 classified documents. Personnel records reflect COLEMAN born 11/29/18, New York, NY. His father was born in Russia; mother in Poland. Both parents claim U.S. citizenship. He entered CCNY 1934, attaining B.S.E.E. there 1938. He studied at the University of Michigan September, 1938 to January, 1939. He was employed as an engineer in the U.S. Army Signal Corps Laboratories, Fort Monmouth, 3/39 to 1/44. He served as radar officer USMC 1/44 to 1/46 and returned to Fort Monmouth employment 1/46. He now serves as Section Chief, Systems Section, Radar Branch, Evans Signal Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, and resides with his wife at 42 Branchport Avenue, Long Branch, NJ.

DETAILS:

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

Investigation in this matter was predicated upon the fact that MORTON SOBELL, in completing his Personnel Security Questionnaire at the Reeves Instrument Corporation, New York City, listed one AARON COLEMAN, Vreeland Place, Port-au-Peck, New Jersey, as a reference whom he had known for twelve years.

o/s [AARON H. COLEMAN, in connection with his employment with the United States Army Signal Corps, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, listed the address of Vreeland Place, Port-au-Peck, New Jersey, as his residence from April to October, 1947.

MORTON SOBELL was arrested by Special Agents of the FBI on August 18, 1950, at Laredo, Texas.

A complaint had previously been filed in the Southern District of New York on August 3, 1950, charging SOBELL with violation of Title 50, Section 34, United States Code (1946 Edition).

Confidential Informant Newark T-1, a representative of another Government Agency which conducts intelligence investigations, advised that COLEMAN originally came to the attention of his agency during 1942 when it was reported that COLEMAN had attended several meetings of the Young Communist League while a student at the City College of New York, and that he approved of the Young Communist League theories. Newark T-1 advised that he had also received reports alleging that COLEMAN had expressed opinions which were closely allied with the Communist trend of thought.

The Young Communist League is one of the organizations cited by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Newark T-1 further advised that COLEMAN had violated Security Regulations upon two occasions by non-compliance with the instructions concerning the handling of classified documents. Newark T-1 said that these violations occurred while COLEMAN was a civilian employee of the Signal Corps at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. [On August 23, 1950, Newark T-1 advised that he had caused an examination of the visitors' passes of the Evans Signal Laboratory to be made and that the examination reflected that on June 26, 1947 one M. SOBELL had registered as a representative of the Reeves Instrument Corporation, New York City, to visit AARON COLEMAN. Newark T-1 explained that AARON COLEMAN is now and was during 1947 a civilian employee in the Radar Branch at Evans Signal Laboratory.

o/s [Mr. A. J. DALTON, Chief, Signal Corps Procurement Agency, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, advised that the Reeves Instrument Corporation, originally known as the Reeves Sound Laboratories, Inc., New York City, was first awarded contracts with the Signal Corps Engineering Laboratories at Fort Monmouth on May 24, 1944. He added that since that time they have been engaged in the performance of work on Signal Corps contracts.

[With reference to the contracts held by the Reeves Instrument Corporation, Newark T-1 advised that a search of the records of his agency failed to reflect that MORTON SOBELL had been cleared as a representative of the Reeves Instrument Corporation for access to classified information in connection with visits by the Reeves Corporation representatives to the Signal Corps Engineering Laboratory.] He explained that when a civilian company entered a contract to perform work for the Signal Corps they submitted the names of these men who would confer with the Signal Corps personnel on problems and technical difficulties arising from the work covered by the contracts. He stated that an investigation is made of these individuals by the Signal Corps to determine if these individuals have backgrounds that would permit their having access to classified information of the Army.

[Newark T-1 further advised that, although SOBELL's name was not among those receiving such clearance, he and any other representative of the Reeves Corporation would be permitted to enter the Laboratories in connection with the contracts; however, it would then be up to the employee visited to prohibit the visitor from having access to any classified information.]

LOVENSTEIN as an Evans employee had access to the information contained in the library there and that it was no infraction of security regulations for COLEMAN to make literature and films from this library available to another employee. During the course of the LOE investigation concerning LOVENSTEIN, the following background information was ascertained:

LOVENSTEIN was born May 5, 1922 at Chicago, Illinois; graduated from the City College of New York August, 1943, and served in the United States Army July 24, 1943 to February 13, 1946. He was appointed to his position as radio engineer, Radar Branch, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, on November 17, 1947.

The investigation was based on the fact that while LOVENSTEIN was employed at the Fairchild Engine and Aircraft Company, Farmingdale, Long Island, he had been a member of Local 231, FAECT-CIO, which was reportedly headed by known Communists. Investigation in the Newark Office reflected no derogatory information concerning LOVENSTEIN. The source of the basis was MID, Washington, D.C.

o/s In further regard to LOVENSTEIN, Newark T-1 advised that on June 25, 1950, an informant of his office had reported to him that on that day LOVENSTEIN and one DANIEL GOLDENBERG, another Evans employee, on entering a room at the Laboratory, began a discussion as to the possibility of civil uprising in New York City. Informant, who had been in a position where LOVENSTEIN and GOLDENBERG could not see him, made his presence known and the conversation was immediately switched to speculation as to whether there would be looting, etc. of New York City under Communist direction if and when the city was bombed or in case of a like emergency. Informant had previously advised Newark T-1 that GOLDENBERG had during a conversation at Evans seemed proud of the fact that his brother, HERBERT WILLIAM GOLDENBERG, age 30, 1350 Shakespeare Avenue, New York City, had turned down an offer of the Air Force to become a meteorological officer.

In an effort to ascertain if there had been any further connection between LOVENSTEIN and COLEMAN or between LOVENSTEIN or MORTON SOBELL, a check of the visitors' register at Evans Signal Laboratory was made for the period which LOVENSTEIN has been employed there. No such contact or association was indicated therein.

The card also bears the notation "First Lieutenant, Artillery Corp, four and one half years, disorganized Russian White Army at end of war."

In connection with SOORIN it is noted that the New York Office by letter dated September 19, 1950 advised that a review of MORTON SOBELL's personal directory located among his personal effects contained the name S. TINOFF followed by the word "approval" and Camp Evans together with an illegible name believed to be SOORIN was also listed with the telephone number Easton 3-0600 and a notation and the name "Watson Laboratory."

0/5 It was ascertained that this telephone number is the number of the Watson Laboratory, Air Materiel Command, located at Eatontown, New Jersey with the mailing address of Redbank, New Jersey.

The "Camp Evans" undoubtedly refers to Evans Signal Laboratory which during the World War II was known as Camp Evans and was then as now a sub-division of Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

Mr. ALBERT W. BUSH, Office of the Air Provost Marshal, Watson Laboratories, made available the only record he had of an individual named SOORIN. This consisted of an index card in the name of ANDREW J. SOORIN, Engineer, Radio Radar Laboratory, Watson Laboratories.

SUROVELL denied knowing SOBELL and stated that he never has been and is not now a member of the Communist Party and that his wife, ESTHER, has never been a member of the Communist Party. He did state, however, that he was a member of the Washington Bookshop from 1942 until 1946 but that when he read in the newspapers that the Bookshop was a Communist front organization, he requested that his name be removed from the membership list. He also stated that he had attended a meeting of the American Youth Congress sometime in 1940 or 1941. He stated that he was invited and did not participate as an official or a member. At the time of the interview, a statement was taken by the interviewing agents but SUROVELL refused to sign it.

Mr. Jacob Greenspan, Assistant to the Superintendent, SeaView Hospital, New York, N.Y., indicated that one Jacob Land, 35 F. Washington Avenue, New York, N.Y., had been admitted on 24 March 1953, suffering from Tuberculosis and had expired on 30 March 1953. Land had listed one Dr. M. Cantor, 21 Montgomery Place, Brooklyn, N.Y., a nephew by marriage, as his next of kin. He made no mention of Helen Land or Helen Land Jacobs in his hospital history statement. 66511

VOTING CHECK: A check of the Board of Elections, New York County, N.Y., does not reveal a registration for Fannie Wolf from 1950-1952, but does show Meyer Wolf as registered in one of the two major political parties for that period.

A Local Agency Check, including, New York (NY) Police (14 July 1953); USAP (OSI) 2d District (13 July 1953); G-2 1st. Army (16 July 1953) and FBI (NY) (10 July 1953) and DIO-3ND revealed no identifiable derogatory information concerning Fannie or Meyer Wolf. Files of FBI (NY) do reflect that FBI on 26 October 1948, conducted a full field investigation on JACOBS who was employed at Guam Air Force Base. It was revealed that one Lewis G. Haas, Jr., was a full time New York Communist Party functionary who lived with Subject as a common law husband. FBI Laboratory having examined a signature on Communist Party Nominating Petition for "Brotsky, Anter and Santiago", which was signed in New York in 1941, believed signature to be that of Haas. In 1937-1941, Haas registered with the American Labor Party, and was known to be an ardent Communist Party Member by neighbors and associates. Subject supposed to have been member of the Young Communist League. Neighbors described her as being of low morals having lived with negroes. JACOB's former address was 643 Hudson St., New York, N.Y., where she lived since October 1941. Haas, on 29 December 1948 was listed as Westchester County State Committeeman for the Communist Party, also known as an active worker in the Communist Party. Subject was supposed to have been active in Camp Unity, Wingdale, N.Y., which she listed as a residence in 1942.

Files of DIO-3ND contain complete case file on Morton Sobell, convicted atom spy and ex-associate of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, convicted atom spies, executed 18 June 1953 dated 25 November 1941. This case file indicates that Miss Helen Land, now Mrs. JACOBS, of 643 Hudson St., New York, N.Y., was described as a "rabid communist" and a possible associate of Morton Sobell, by Linton Weil, Subject's former employer at Weil's Camp, Wingdale, N.Y.

Said files further reflect that the Young Communist League has been cited by the U. S. Attorney General as a Communist Organization; that the American Labor Party has been cited as Communist dominated by the California Committee on Un-American Activities and that Camp Unity is one of several camps and training schools in New York State either operated by the Communist Party or catering to Communists.

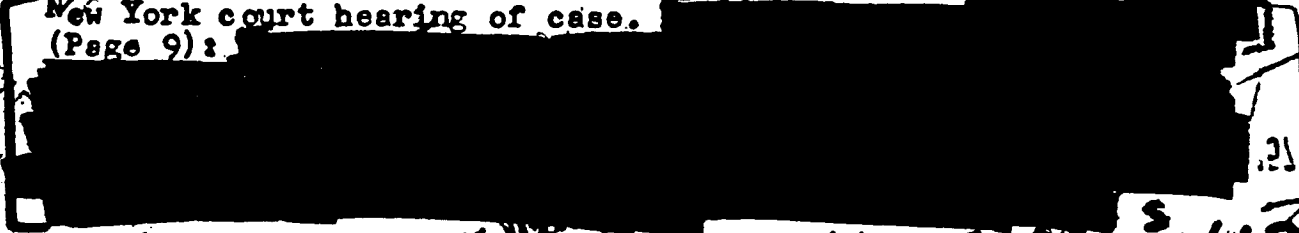

ACTIVITIES IN MEXICO CONCERNING MORTON SOBELL CASE

On February 1, 1957, LUIS SANCHEZ PONTON, a Mexican attorney who was formerly Mexican Ambassador to Russia, appeared at the U. S. Embassy and requested a visa to travel to the United States, stating that the purpose of his trip was "pleasure" and that he wanted to consult an oculist there and visit with a "colleague." He was informed by the Visa Section of the Embassy that a visa could not be immediately issued to him and that an investigation would have to be conducted. The Office of the Legal Attache had been previously advised that LUIS SANCHEZ PONTON had been retained by individuals who were attempting to secure a new trial for MORTON SOBELL in attempting to secure evidence on which a new trial could be based. It also had received information that members of the American Communist Group in Mexico were collecting funds to send an attorney to the United States in connection with this affair.



SOBELL listed the applicant as a reference when he started working for Reeves Instrument Company.

The pending investigation disclosed that the applicant is residing with another woman, identity unknown.

Miss KAMIL'S name appeared on a list of persons who are believed to have attended a reception or dinner, on an unknown date, given by MIODRAG MARKOVIC, Yugoslav Consul General at N. Y. Investigation in the case entitled, YAKOV ABRAMOVICH, WAS. ESPIONAGE - R, (Bufile 100-356962) reflected that ABRAMOVICH'S sister, LILLY GROSS, stated that she had been called by, or contacted by, DORIT KAMIL in New York. It is noted that [REDACTED]

New York files reflect that CHARLES H. ALSPACH was a friend of HENRY HILL COLLINS, Jr., a subject in the Gregory case, and for a period of time in 1946, resided in COLLINS'S residence at Lanham, Maryland. ALSPACH is known to have received correspondence from the Southern Conference for Human Welfare. In 1941, ALSPACH was a contributor to the League of American Writers. In December, 1946, ALSPACH is known to have received a letter from JOSEPH SCHRANK in whose home SAM CARR, a Soviet espionage agent, lived in the early part of 1949. It is noted that SCHRANK was interviewed by Bureau agents and was not very cooperative. ALSPACH'S name also appeared on the list of persons who are believed to have attended a reception or dinner given by MARKOVIC, Yugoslav Consul General in New York. Investigation in the case entitled, SALY LIEBERMAN, WAS. Et Al, INTERNAL SECURITY - R, (Bufile 100-346290) reflected that ALSPACH was in correspondence with the LIEBERMANS in January and March, 1948.

Allegations have been received that the LIEBERMANS are Communists. Although possibly of no significance, it is worthy of note that EDITH SYLVIA LEVITOV, sister-in-law of MORTON SOBELL, who has been convicted in New York on espionage charges, was employed as a secretary in the Social Activities Section of the Department of Social Affairs, U. N. on 12/5/49 and submitted her resignation from the U. N. on 2/16/50 to CHARLES ALSPACH.

The records of G-2, Central Records Facility, Dossier Number X7121443, reflect a summary of information dated December 31, 1940 from an MID report of SA H. D. WISE, JR. for the period October 10, 1940 to December 30, 1940 intermittently, copies of which are unavailable. Said report stated:

"An unidentified Mrs. RYAN telephoned the office of Civilian Personnel in the War Department on August 1, 1940, and stated that Mrs. MARGARET OSTROW NOVEMBER is a Communist (Ex. 1).

The records of the War Department (Ex. 4) and the Civil Service Commission (Ex. 5) show that Mrs. NOVEMBER was born on April 12, 1912, in Duluth, Minnesota, and that she is married to HAROLD NOVEMBER, who was born in Newark, New Jersey. (His father was born in Austria and his mother in Russia. His father was naturalized in 1924, when son, HAROLD, was 13 years old (Ex. 7).) These records further show that her father was born in Russia (Naturalized in 1921 when daughter, MARGARET, was 8 years old (Ex. 6),) and her mother in Lithuania. The records of the War Department also show that Mrs. NOVEMBER, during the past five years, has been connected with the Washington Youth Council, the American League for Peace and Democracy, and the Stenographers, Typists and Bookkeepers Union, American Federation of Labor.

Mrs. NOVEMBER lived for ten months in a boarding house at 1736 P Street, N. W., where the interest of her landlady was aroused by frequent meetings of Jewish girls in her room (Ex. 8). Later, her mailing address became 1410 H. Street, N. W., a business building (Ex. 9) where her address coincided with that of the American Youth Congress (Ex. 23 1/2). Mrs. NOVEMBER subsequently

lived at 2106 F Street, N. W., from which place she was evicted because she insisted upon holding mixed meetings of colored and white people in her apartment. (Exs. 11 & 13). From this address she went to 2916 F Street, N. W., where she lived for ten months. At this apartment she was apparently living with an unidentified man and she and the people living with her were generally considered to be Communists, holding mixed meetings of white and colored people, distributing handbills, and possessing Communist literature (Exs. 13-17). After this Mrs. NOVEMBER lived in a small apartment at 5410 3rd Street., N. W. The mail carrier for that address delivered Communist literature to her and the two other girls with whom she lived and considered them to be Communists (Ex. 20). Former neighbors stated that they disapproved of ^{the} three unmarried girls living there with three men but had no other complaint. (Ex. 21).

o/s Mrs. NOVEMBER next lived in Chevy Chase, Maryland, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. KENNETH DECKER. Mr. DECKER's name was listed by the Dies Committee as a member of the American League for Peace and Democracy. (Exs. 64 & 66). She later lived at 1818 Riggs Place, N. W. (Ex. 22). In December, 1939, Mr. and Mrs. NOVEMBER moved to their present address at 1821 M Street, N. W. Their present rental agent knows nothing about them but has received no complaints against them (Ex. 23). Most of her present neighbors who were questioned did not know of her but one reported that often groups of people come from her apartment late at night (Ex. 31).

Surveillance maintained at 1821 M Street, N. W., furnished the information that apparently one of Mrs. NOVEMBER's associates is one MORTON SOBELL, whose car has been seen discharging passengers at anti-conscription meetings (Exs. 37 & 38).

o/s A mail cover maintained at Mrs. NOVEMBER's residence disclosed that she is apparently Secretary of the Washington Youth Council and is in correspondence with the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the National Federal for Constitutional Liberties (Ex. 47).

Two of the persons given by Mrs. NOVEMBER as references have stated they believe her to be loyal to this country, but both
